\_\_\_\_, it is healthy to examine everything we believe -- even to question everything. God wants us to believe because of evidence.

In this issue it is obvious Jesus is the Messiah. In the Old Testament there are at least 456 specific prophecies of the Messiah that Jesus fulfilled to the letter. (Josh McDowell, Evidence that Demands a Verdict lists most of them). The statistical probability of a single person fulfilling them all is 1 in 10 followed by 17 zeros

To me a clincher is Genesis 49: 10-11 where it is stated that Messiah would come before Israel lost its self-rule. That happened with the Roman conquest in 70 AD.

Confusion comes with the prophecies (such as in Zechariah) that Messiah would come during great cataclysmic events, war and earthquakes. Obviously that was not the case when Jesus was on earth.

Those passages refer to His Second Coming at the Battle of Armageddon. I'm actually going to cover some of this Sunday. {Life of Jesus #50}  
By the way I asked Thibodeaux and he agreed!
